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Point 29. Does the German government consider the so-called BDS-Campaign aimed at Israel (BDS – Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions) to be anti-Semitic?

- b) Is the BDS campaign or its supporters, to the government's knowledge, under the surveillance of the Federal Office of the Protection of the Constitution or any of the regional Offices of the Protection of the Constitution?

The questions 29, 29a and 29b will be answered together.

The German government has no knowledge of activities by the named campaign that, in accordance with §3 of the Protection of the Constitution Law (BverfSchG), would permit surveillance by the Federal Office of the Protection of the Constitution.

The Federal Government has not received knowledge in the sense of the interrogation. The Federal Office of the Protection of the Constitution, likewise has no knowledge of surveillance of this campaign by a regional office of the Protection of the Constitution.
